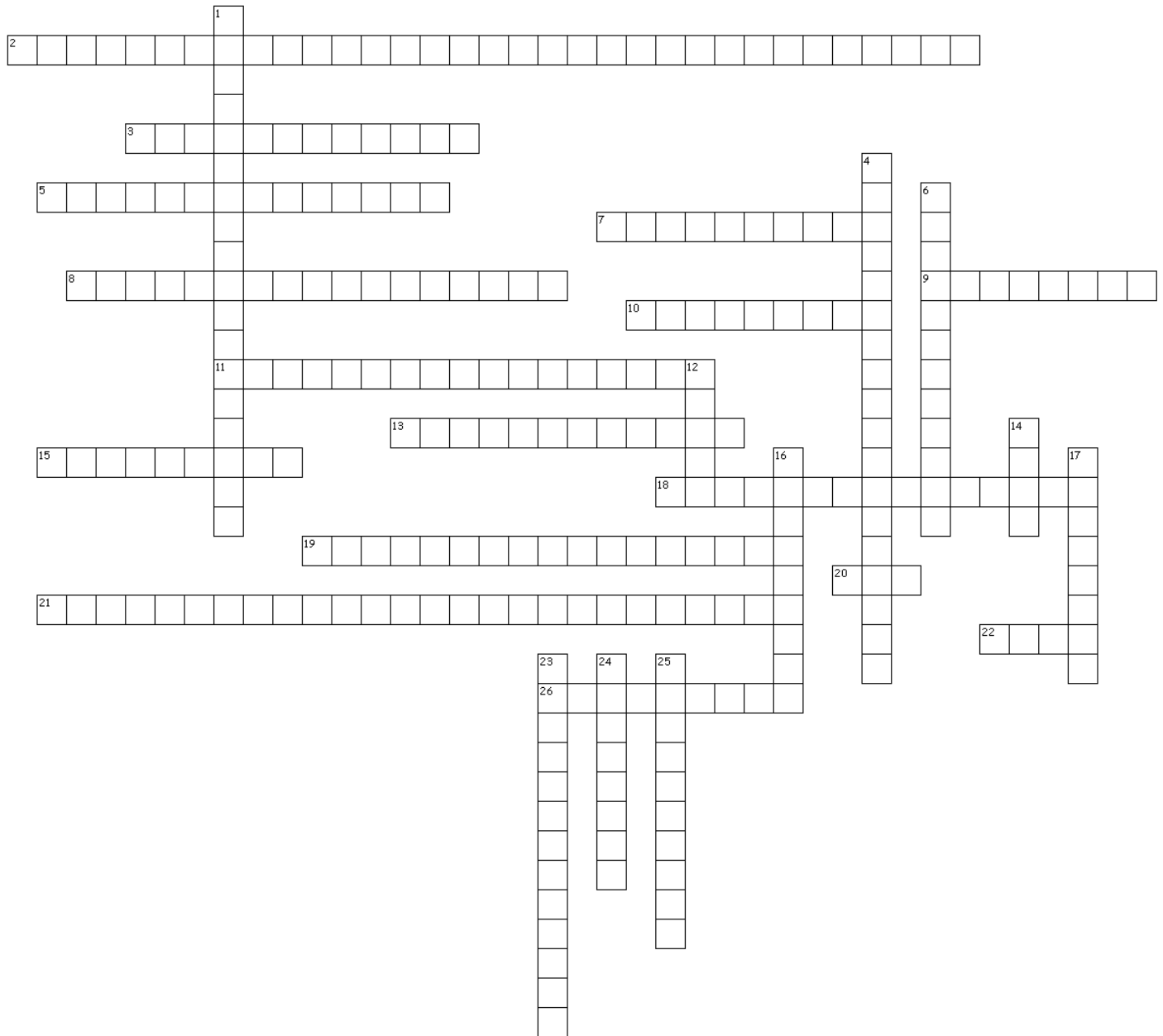


# District Final Review Puzzle 1

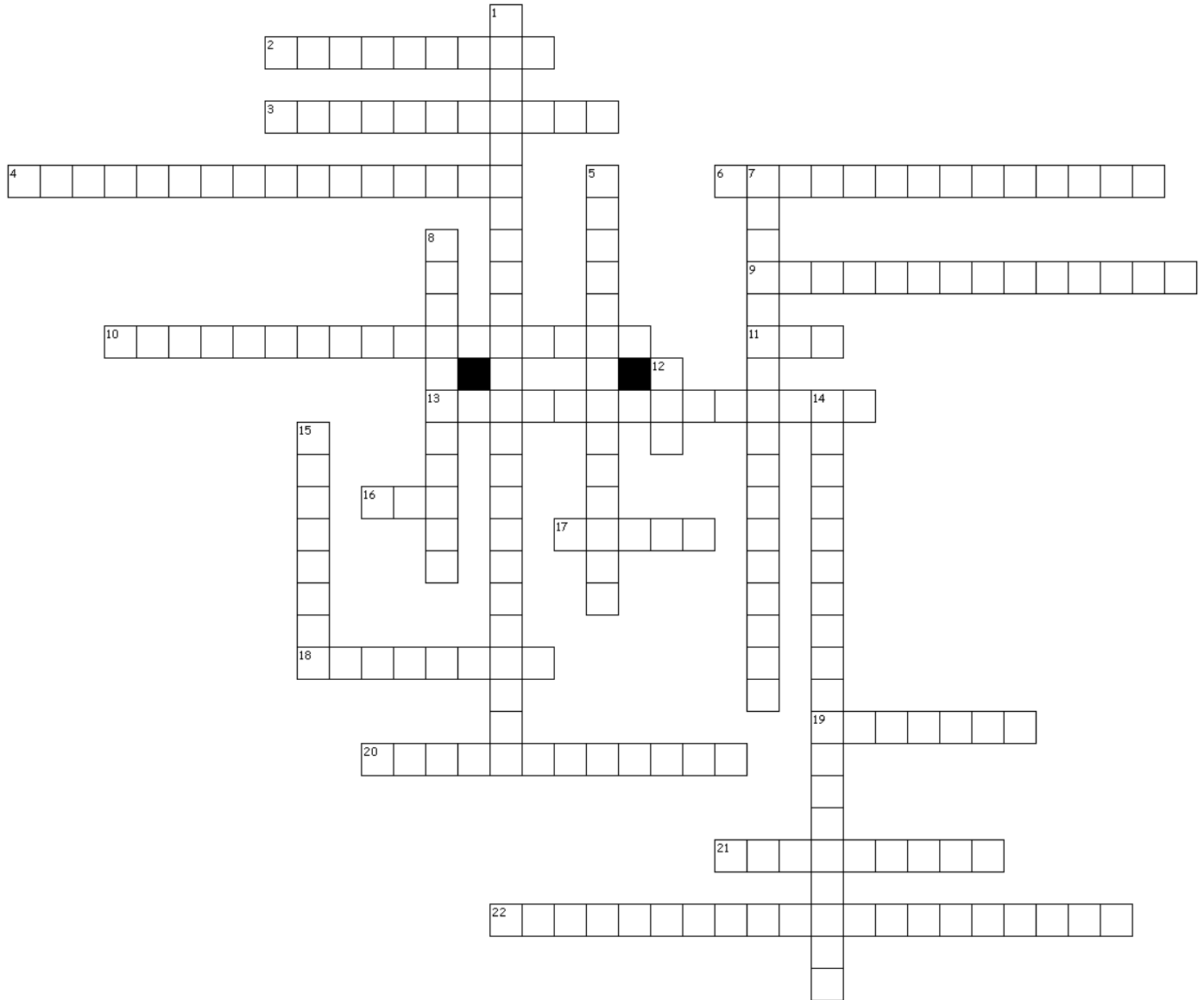
2. The United Nations' statement of the intent to protect basic freedoms of people around the world; inspired in part by FDR's Four Freedoms Speech
3. In this speech FDR stated ideals for the post-war world and pledged to supply the Allies
5. Presidential policy that the US would aid countries that were threatened by communism
7. In order to end WWII quickly and save American lives, Truman attacks with this weapon
8. The invasion of Normandy, France, was known by this code name
9. Truman's proposals that eventually led to the increase of minimum wage; social security benefits, and public housing assistance
10. McCarthyism, the Korean War, the Cuban Missile Crisis, and fallout shelters all reflect the concern that communism was spreading
11. They transmitted secret messages to US forces during combat using their native language
13. Aid program to help rebuild the war-torn economies of western Europe
15. This act meant that the US would send ships, planes, tanks, and guns to the Allies in WWII
18. Symbol of the campaign to get women to work in the defense industry during WWII
19. This was passed in order to make it easier to mobilize the military during a national crisis
20. The US embargo on scrap metal and THIS caused the Japanese to bomb Pearl Harbor
21. The Supreme Court ruled in the Korematsu case that this was constitutional during WWII
22. Mutual defense alliance between the US and Western European countries to oppose communism

26. The Soviet launch of Sputnik caused Americans to fear that the US was losing this

1. WWII agency that oversaw the control and distribution of raw materials and supplies
4. US/Soviet standoff over whether the Soviets would put missiles on an island near the US; led to a nuclear test ban treaty and other agreements
6. This resolution of Congress allowed Johnson to send troops to Vietnam without a formal declaration of war
12. Alliance between the US and Asian-Pacific countries to oppose communism
14. This UN treaty arranged the reduction of tariffs in order to increase international trade
16. The US invasion of Cambodia led to antiwar protests at this university where four students were shot
17. Workers who came as part of a program encourage migrant laborers from Mexico to fill US agricultural jobs
23. US strategy to acquire more bases in the Pacific to move within striking distance of Japan
24. The development of antibiotics and these led to an increase in life expectancy
25. Symbol of the division between East and West over communism; its removal represented the end of the Cold War

2. One of the main focuses of the NAACP during the mid-1900s was to challenge racial segregation in this
3. Both Martin Luther King of the SCLC and James Farmer of CORE believed in this philosophy regarding protests
4. The experiences of this group in WWII caused them to fight for the end to segregation and discrimination after the war
6. 1947 law; revised the Wagner Act; limited the rights of labor unions; passed despite President Truman's veto and union opposition
9. This 1965 law ended the practice of basing immigration policy on national origin quotas; it resulted in a more ethnically diverse population
10. Cesar Chavez and Dolores Huerta were leaders in the organization of this union
11. Civil Rights leader who wrote to other Christian ministers defending his policy of direct, non-violent civil disobedience (abbr.)
13. This 1965 law protected African Americans from discriminatory voter registration laws
16. Rachel Carson's book Silent Spring generated awareness of environmental issues and led to the creation of this agency (abbr.)
17. Agreement to improve trade between North American countries (abbr.)
18. Civil rights leader who advocated separatism, Black Nationalism and striking back at those who oppressed blacks
19. Region of the U.S., particularly in the Southeast and Southwest, which grew in population due to defense jobs in WWII and warmer climate
20. Johnson's 1960s social programs to fight poverty and racial discrimination
21. Scandal in which Pres. Nixon covered up political misdeeds and was forced to resign from office; showed that the president is not above the law
22. Battle in which the U.S. and its allies fought Iraq because of its invasion of Kuwait

1. Betty Friedan's book, The Feminine Mystique, led to this movement which pushed for the Equal Pay Act, Title IX education amendment, and the ERA
5. This law, pushed through Congress in 1964, enforced desegregation in the schools and public places
7. The University of California v. Bakke case was a challenge of this system of ending racial and gender discrimination in the colleges
8. Case in which segregation was ruled unconstitutional and Chief Justice Earl Warren stated that "separate but equal" had no place in education
12. This movement worked to help Native Americans gain civil rights and economic improvements (abbr.)
14. This movement was responsible for inspiring protest by other groups and for pushing anti-discrimination laws through Congress
15. Spike in birthrate related to the post-war prosperity and economic confidence following WWII
