



- He found himself in constant demand for speeches, parades, and honorary degrees. The pressure wore on him; he said to a friend: "Not a day goes by but I hear from some of my old outfit, usually about some sorrow or misfortune. I cannot bear it much more."
- Whittlesey was a pallbearer for the unknown soldier laid to rest at Arlington National Cemetery in 1921; a few days later he sailed for Cuba, but disappeared on the first night out. It is presumed that he committed suicide.



I desire to publish to the command an official recognition of the valor and extraordinary heroism in action of the officers and enlisted men of the following organizations:

Companies A, B, C, E, G, H 308th

308th Infantry

Company K

307th Infantry

Companies C, D

306th Machine Gun Btln.

These organizations, or detachments therefrom, comprised the approximate force of 550 men under command of Major Charles W. Whittlesey, which was cut off from the remainder of the Seventy-Seventh Division and surrounded by a superior number of the enemy near Charlevaux, in the Forest d'Argonne, from the morning of October 3, 1918, to the night of October 7, 1918.

Without food for more than one hundred hours, harassed continuously by machine gun, rifle, trench mortar and grenade fire, Major Whittlesey's command, with undaunted spirit and magnificent courage, successfully met and repulsed daily violent attacks by the enemy. They held the position which had been reached by supreme efforts, under orders received for an advance, until communication was re-established with friendly troops.

When relief finally came, approximately 194 officers and men were able to walk out of the position. Officers and men killed numbered 107.


On the fourth day a written proposition to surrender received from the Germans was treated with the contempt which it deserved.

The officers and men of these organizations during these five days of isolation continually gave unquestionable proof of extraordinary heroism and demonstrated the high standard and ideals of the United States Army.

April 15, 1919^[4]



Officers and Men Being Presented with Medal of Honor at Chaumont, February 9, 1919









1st Lt. Harold Goettler

U.S. Army Air Service aviator killed in action on October 6, 1918 while locating the Lost Battalion of the 77th Division during World War I. He died of wounds resulting from German fire from the ground during the flight. For his actions, he posthumously received the Medal of Honor.

NAMES OF THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE LOST BATTALION WHO WERE CUT OFF AND SUR-ROUNDED BY THE ENEMY IN THE ARGONNE FOREST, OCTOBER 3D, 1918

On October 8th, about 3 P.M. 194 officers and men were assembled by Major Whittlesey and Captain McMurtry at the foot of the Pocket. This force represented all that was left of the original command of approximately 550 officers and men who were able to walk out of the position, and many of them were wounded. The wounded men who were not able to walk were carried up to the ambulances on the Charlevaux Road. Exactly how many of these men were carried out it is impossible to say. But the approximate figures would run about as follows:

These lists of names, collected in France during March and April, 1919, are only fairly accurate, as many officers and men were still scattered about in hospitals, or had been sent to other Divisions. In several cases new Company Commanders simply asked their men which of them had been in the Pocket, and what names they remembered of men still in the hospitals. The list of killed, wounded, captured or missing is not complete.
