This is intended to be a one-stop document with all the links that you will need to be successful in distance learning in US History. In my class, we will continue to use Remind, as we have all year, but probably much more often. Also, I'll still be referring you to my website. But I will also be using Google Classroom for some assignments, and I may also invite you to participate in live class lessons or discussions using the teleconferencing app, "Zoom." It is the next best thing to an in-person class.

Office Hours — My Office hours will be: Tuesday and Thursday from 11 am to 12 noon.

All Centennial teachers have posted their Office Hours just like college professors do. This means that they each have certain days and times when they will be available to talk to you. Mine are posted in the bold heading above. This means that you can text me on Remind or email me (see below) and I will be available live at the time, meaning that you can expect that I will reply immediately, or as close to immediately as I can, depending on how many people contact me at one time. If there is interest, I may also hold Office Hours in a Zoom meeting. Either way, you can still contact me through Remind or by email any other time that you like; I will get back to you as soon as I can in either case.

Zoom: You will need to have the Zoom app on whatever device you use to participate in a Zoom meeting. But you don't have to have an account; you can just join with a code that the teacher will send you. Here is the link to where the downloads of apps are on the Zoom site. You can just use your app store as well. I will post more Zoom information when I schedule our first Zoom meeting. Note: If you have limited access and cannot attend a Zoom meeting, I understand. I will be communicating by email and Remind, as well as on my website, so just keep in touch that way.

Course Material: I have already been doing distance learning with all of you since I assigned you the puzzle and study guide for Units 4 and 5 (1920s and 1930s) and the Kahoot review activity. You will just need to upload scans of the two handouts you've completed. I also have lots of things on my website ready for you to do from home and will be directing you as to what other things you can do to complete this unit and a couple more. My goal is for you to finish the 1920s/1930s unit, do the WWII unit, a brief Cold War/Post War unit, including the Vietnam War, and the Civil Rights Unit.

My plan is to have you watch one last video about the end of the 1930s (the assignment is going to be on the US History tab of my website), give you a chance to ask any questions from the 1920s and 1930s study guide (you can do this by Remind or by email any time you like starting on Monday, Apr. 13), and to have a Zoom meeting to answer any questions and just to catch up with you (probably on Tues. Apr. 14 or Thursday Apr. 15). My hope is that you can study and practice using the Kahoot (I will assign one more practice opportunity with that), and then I will turn the Kahoot activity into a "test" and you can take it to fulfill the Unit 4/5 Exam.

After that, I will direct you to use my website (which I am updating bit by bit) to watch a couple of the "The Century" videos about WWII, watch my WWII slide lecture (there is a screencast of it), hold a Zoom meeting to talk about WWII, relate the crisis then to the crisis now, and answer questions, watch a couple of episodes of "Band of Brothers," and read a couple of articles about issues that stemmed from WWII.

Then we will go into the Post War/Cold War unit, in which I'll have you watch a couple more The Century videos, do a slide lecture (which I may do as a Zoom lecture), watch "Dear America: Letters Home from Vietnam," and, if I can arrange for him to do a Zoom meeting with me, hear a Vietnam Veteran talk about his experiences (it would include a slideshow of his photos from his time in Vietnam).

Finally, we will look at the Civil Rights movement, in which you'll watch a couple more "The Century" videos, an episode of "Eyes on the Prize" about the desegregation of the schools, and two episodes of "Chicano! The History of the Mexican-American Civil Rights Movement," along with the rest of my slide lecture, and reading a couple of articles from the time period.
